Understanding your child from toddler to teenager

If you would like to know more about your child's development and better understand their behaviour. Join one our fun and relaxed groups to explore topics such as:

- Developmental needs
- Family fun
- Communication
- Sleep
- Behaviour difficulties

Consisting of two hourly sessions over a 10-week period, this group is suitable for families with children and young people from birth to 19 years old.

#### Understanding your child/teen with additional needs

This relaxed group is designed to bring parents and carers of children and young people with additional needs the opportunity to meet other families in similar situations and develop your knowledge through peer support.

Groups runs over 10 weeks and will lay the foundation for understanding your child and considers topics, such as:

- Behavioural difficulties
- Developmental and play needs.
- Parenting styles
- Sleep
- Explore feelings.
- Ways to relax.
- Understand brain development.
- Relationships

## Weekly News from Wren Class - Miss Stanley

It was lovely to welcome the children back after the half term break. Everyone was eager to share what they had been up to and who with. Our new topic is Once Upon a Time and the key text this week is The Frog Prince. This week, we created a whole class story map for The Frog Prince and added actions for key words such as frog, princess, and ball. The children practised retelling the story with actions before filming the performance and having it peer assessed. The children were full of praise for one another and were kind when feeding back an area of improvement. The children have also enjoyed using the iPads to play a phonics game called Buried Treasure on Phonics Play. This is a free game that you might like to access at home. Type in <u>www.phonicsplay.com</u> - scroll down to the 'Play Free Resources' tab and click - select Buried Treasure, Dragon's Den or Picnic on Pluto - Click phase 2, 3 or 4 - Click 'Revise all Phase' -

allow your child to read each word and decide if it is real or fake. Please monitor your child when accessing online games. Thank you.

## Weekly News from Robin Class - Miss Underhill

It has been a great first week back for Robin class. They have shown that they are ready for the last term as little Robins and have been ready to work hard on our new learning sequences. In English we have started to share a story called Major Glad and Major Dizzy, all about toy soldiers lost under the floorboards of an old house. We have been using our predicting skills to work out how they got there and how they might be rescued. In maths we have started a unit of learning all about measures and have been finding out how to order, compare and measure length. We have used non-standard and standard units to measure classroom objects. Our new history topic has started us thinking about our school and how old it might be. So far, we have discovered that it was built in the Victorian times.

#### Weekly News from Owl Class - Mrs. Eggleton

A short week for us in Owls but packed with lots of activities as usual. We had some very good discussions and ideas about how we should show respect to each other, those we should show respect to and how we can respect our school. The children began the week by exploring using pastels to create beautiful drawings of rainforest animals. In maths children have been practising our mental and written methods, particularly in addition and subtraction. In English we have begun looking at the legend of King Arthur and the round table. We focused upon the story of the Sword in the Stone, learning about the various knights, good and evil characters. I am particularly proud of our Year 4 children's courage and composure as they tackled their multiplication times tables check this week. Their hard work and resilience over the last two years to learn their times tables has certainly paid off and this skill will stand them in good stead for maths in the middle schools next year. Well, done Year 4.
